Chaplaincy

Counselling

Our free and confidential professional Counselling Service helps students develop skills and strategies that enable you to achieve your personal and academic goals, making your time at university more comfortable and stress-free. The Counselling Service also offers phone counselling to ensure that you can access this resource off campus.

Learning support

Throughout your degree, you will have access to a range of learning support programs online and on campus to help you succeed at university. Most support is provided free of charge and is delivered via demand-driven workshops and individual appointments with a Learning Advisor. You can join workshops on topics designed to address the challenges common to university life, such as referencing and academic integrity, time management, academic essay writing, critical reading, note-taking, understanding feedback from assessments, and exam anxiety.

Maths support

You can brush up on some maths fundamentals if you are studying a program where maths is a requirement. To help you along the way, we provide a wide range of options to support your studies in mathematics. There are online resources and lively Q&A discussion boards, as well as drop-in services for small groups and one on one support.

English as an additional language support

If English is not your first language and you need additional assistance to manage your studies in English, you can make an appointment to see a Learning Advisor with specialised skills in English for Academic Purposes. You can make one on one appointments and/or join small study groups to build your skills.

Support for Indigenous students

Notre Dame is committed to providing an educational environment that acknowledges, respects and embraces Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' cultures. The University provides culturally appropriate support for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. An Indigenous Student Support Officer is available to work with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and oversee the coordination of additional support that assists students. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students will be able to access additional funding for their study success through the Indigenous Student Success Program.

Access and inclusion

Research institutes

Institute for Ethics & Society

The Institute for Ethics & Society (IES) aims to foster ethical awareness in professional and social life. This is achieved via four integrated activities:

- Developing a vibrant research agenda in targeted fields of academic study
- Providing expertise in ethics education for students and staff at Notre Dame
- Delivering training services for industry in areas of professional ethics
- Facilitating public engagement on issues of ethical importance

The IES research focus areas include Moral Philosophy & Ethics Education, Bioethics & Healthcare Ethics, and Religion & Global Ethics.

Institute for Health Research

The Institute for Health Research (IHR) provides expertise in the design and analysis of complex health research with University researchers and those in the wider healthcare system. Through supervision of postgraduate research students and involvement in collaborative studies with other academic and clinical researchers, the IHR has a vibrant research focus with strong industry links that seeks to improve the health and wellbeing of the community.

Nulungu Research Institute

The Nulungu Research Institute focuses on three core research themes – caring for Country; education; and Aboriginal wellbeing and health – within a context of valuing Aboriginal knowledge. Based at Notre Dame Broome, a Campus of Reconciliation, our research is guided by the core principle of 'Right People, Right Country, Right Way'.

A key feature of Nulungu's research profile is impactful community-driven collaborative projects with national and international academic institutions, teaching and research communities, government, and industry.

Architecture enhances people's lives through the creation of meaningful human environments. Many key challenges of contemporary society – such as sustainability, housing affordability, ageing-in-place, city living and community building – often involve spatial issues. Architecture applies a holistic way of thinking and acting to combine creative design processes and technical skills with understandings of human, cultural and environmental issues. Your first step on this journey is our Bachelor of Arts (Architecture) degree.


This degree allows you to complete a Minor in a complementary discipline parallel to your architectural studies, expanding your career opportunities by providing pathways into professions alongside the traditional pathway to registration as an architect (after completing the Master of Architecture).

As with all our degrees, the Doctor of Medicine places a strong emphasis on practical training and experiential learning. Throughout the four years of your study you will undertake clinical placements in a variety of settings including aged care facilities, public and private hospitals and general practice.

Your third and fourth years are clinically based and present the opportunity to explore the different disciplines of medicine such as paediatrics and surgery. You will complete discipline-based rotations in a clinical setting, and further develop your research skills with a translational research project and/or clinical audit based in the hospital sector. Studying for a Doctor of Medicine (MD) is demanding and entry is highly competitive. The Pre-Medicine Certificate is designed for students who are interested in applying for Medicine at Notre Dame, Fremantle upon the completion of their undergraduate degree.

Spanning three compulsory subjects and one elective, these subjects are studied alongside your undergraduate degree. Over the course of your studies, you will undertake subjects such as Health, Medicine and Society; Culture Care, Diversity and Universality; Human Caring through Service Learning; as well as an elective in areas like Aboriginal People, Behavioural Science, Biological Science, Counselling Skills and more. You will be guided by the Pre-Medicine Certificate Team who will help you with your journey through the Pre-Medicine Certificate program.

Please Note: The completion of the Pre-Medicine Certificate does not guarantee you entry to the School of Medicine. However, should you meet the required GPA and GAMSAT scores, and successfully complete the Pre-Medicine Certificate program, you will automatically progress to the interview stage for graduate Medicine at Notre Dame's Fremantle Campus.

Notre Dame does not have prerequisite subjects, however, you must achieve 50 percent scaled score in ATAR English, English Literature or English as an additional language or dialect to meet English Language requirements.

Special Tertiary Admissions Test

For Mature Age applicants (20+ years of age), the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) is designed to demonstrate your ability to progress with tertiary studies. Notre Dame requires you to complete both the Written English and Multiple Choice forms of STAT.

Vocational Education & Training

If you have successfully completed a relevant Certificate IV (post-Year 12), Diploma or Advanced Diploma level qualification at a RTO, you are considered to have met the academic minimum entry requirements for access to many degrees at Notre Dame.

If you have completed a Certificate IV in Year 12, and meet English Language requirements, you can apply for degrees in Arts & Sciences and Business – with the exception of a Bachelor of Arts (Architecture).

Notre Dame is committed to making all its programs as affordable and accessible as possible, with its fee structure reflecting this goal.

Commonwealth Supported Places and HECS-HELP

The University of Notre Dame Australia is now classified as a Table A university. This means that all undergraduate programs offer Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP). Students allocated a CSP will have a portion of their tuition fees paid by the Commonwealth Government.

Australian citizens, holders of permanent humanitarian visas and eligible New Zealand citizens who are in a CSP are able to access HECS-HELP to defer all or part of their tuition fees through a Commonwealth Government loan which is paid back when the borrower's income reaches a certain threshold.

Permanent residents of Australia and New Zealand citizens who are not eligible for HECS-HELP can still apply for a CSP to receive the lower fee rate but must pay their student contribution amount in full by the first course Census Date.

How fees are calculated

Students who have a CSP have their fees calculated against Fee Bands set by the Commonwealth Government. The cost of a course will depend on the Fee Band that the course belongs to. For example, a student enrolled in a Bachelor of Education (Secondary), will study Education courses in Band 1 but may also wish to study Business courses that come under Band 4 and, as such, cost more than courses in Band 1.

From 1 January 2021, students who have a CSP and are also eligible for HECS-HELP, will receive a 10% discount on payments received by the University of \$500 or more towards the student contribution amount prior to the first Census Date.

How do I apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place?

Upon enrolment in your courses at Notre Dame, you will be sent an invitation email from the Government to complete an electronic Commonwealth Assistance Form (eCAF). As part of this application, you will also be asked to submit your Tax File Number (TFN) and apply for a Unique Student Identifier (USI).

Students should consult studyassist.gov.au for further information and up-to-date eligibility requirements.

Pre-University Program

Eligible students undertaking the Tertiary Pathway Program who are allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place and have completed an electronic Commonwealth Assistance Form (eCAF) will pay no tuition fees for this program.

Additional study costs

The additional costs of study will vary from student to student. Additional costs include textbooks, uniforms, accommodation, public transport, photocopying, stationery and food.

Financial assistance
