You'll need to achieve 6 push-ups for females or 15 for males, 20 sit-ups, and a shuttle run score of 6.1.

## ATTEND ENLISTMENT DAY

Have a final medical check, join family and friends for the welcome ceremony, then head straight to Recruit School and an exciting new career in the Navy.
